



### June 2020 – Covid-19 Code of Conduct - Students

As part of our reopening following the 2019 Coronavirus Pandemic. We need to help you to understand how we will keep everybody safe. For our part, there will be cleaning of surface each day. We will make sure that you don't need to touch very many things that other people are touching. If you have any worries at all, just call us. We'll talk them through with you.

Please don't be put off by these extra rules – We just want to make sure that everyone is safe and feels safe during this time.

Our normal rules still apply as well.

- Stay 2m away from and other students wherever possible at all times
- Your temperature might be checked in the entrance before entering the site.
- No students in kitchens – bring your own snacks and drinks
- One student only in toilets at a time
- Sit at your own table
- At the end of the day – antibact your work station and stationary.
- Wash your hands thoroughly when you arrive and regularly throughout the day or use the hand sanitisers provided.
- Try not to touch you face
- Report any health and safety worries to a student support worker
- No touching other students or staff – even to say hello or goodbye
- You can wear a mask if you wish

- Please don't just take any computer, book or equipment – let us know. That way we can antibac it for you.
- If you behave in a way that they become a safety issue to other because you are not following the social distancing rules or due to poor behaviours that you, staff or other students in danger they will be isolated and sent home immediately.

### **If you feel unwell tell someone.**

- Only students who are symptom free or have completed the required isolation period can attend the setting.
- Symptoms of COVID-19 are;
  - A new or persistent cough
  - Loss of taste or smell
  - High temperature
- If a student presents symptoms at school. We must follow government guidance.
  - Isolate the student, and provide them with PPE. Staff will also wear PPE to supervise them.
  - Contact the parent, and alert them to the situation.
  - Advise the parent of the following.
    1. The child is returning home.
    2. The child must be tested by through their local testing center.
    3. If the test returns positive the student must isolate for 14 days or until symptoms have gone.  
They can return to school when symptoms have gone.
    4. If the test returns negative, they can return to school as normal.
- A Positive Case within the school; following a positive test of a child within the school.
  - Swift action to contact – the local Health Protection Team. Warwickshire Public Health, [wphadmin@warwickshire.gov.uk](mailto:wphadmin@warwickshire.gov.uk), 0344 2553 560
  - Public health will carry out a risk assessment, and decide on the course of action.
- If a student has socialized with someone who presents symptoms and is being tested. We must follow government guidance.
  - Isolate the student, and provide them with PPE.
  - Contact the parent, and alert them to the situation.
  - Advise the parent of the following.
    1. Until the test (of the person they have socialized with) has come back they cannot attend.

- II If the test returns positive the student must isolate for 10 days, if symptoms arise, they can be tested themselves.
  - III If the test returns negative, they can return to school as normal.
- Support the student throughout the time they are isolate by checking on them and ensuring they are comfortable.
